The Goal:

Driving Employment, Growth and Competitiveness, by Promoting Employer "Skill Recycling" through Localised On line Skill Exchanges



The Key Objectives Are To Provide Local Customised Skill Exchange Hubs, Based on Travel to Work Areas to:

> Stop skills wastage and redundancy Develop and share skills locally Generate and exchange new ideas Champion new ways of working

Provide skill development opportunities

The Local Skill Exchange Hub Programme Will Deliver Two Immediate Outputs:

• Exchanging staff between local hub members to impact on and reduce the number of local redundancies.

• Offering first class and structured work placement experience to higher education and college students in the locality.



Creating a Local Skill Exchange Hub

- 1. It is anticipated that membership will consist of Local Government, Local Employers, Colleges, Business Membership Bodies e.g. Federation of Small Business, Chamber of Commerce and Trade Unions.
- 2. Endorsement and support is also invited from the local MLA and/or Member of Parliament
- **3.** Funded by Public/Private Sector.

Collective Funding Requirement of £52.000 Payable on Signing of a Three Year License Agreement, Which Comprises of; Year One of £28.000

- Membership License fee paid to Skill Exchange UK of £12.000
- Purchase of Customised Skills Mobility Exchange Solution* £16.000

Year Two and Three - Collective Annual Membership License Fee of £12.000

- Members Online Support Materials and Tools
- Skills Mobility Exchange Solution maintenance and support


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- This initiative has already gained the support of the following organisations:
