

NIABT 'Passive House' Educational Visit

Paul McAlister Architects has invited the NIABT to an educational visit at a 'passive house' on Thursday 30 January 2014.

A 'passive house' is broadly defined as a home built to consume very little or no energy, primarily relying on 'passive' forms of heating, cooling and at times, ventilation. The basic premise is that the home is built with so much insulation that it will require very little heat, (or only the heat generated by its inhabitants, electrical equipment and cooking), to keep it comfortable and warm.

During this educational visit, you will receive a presentation from Paul McAlister Architects about how the passive house concept works and its many benefits. The presentation will be followed by a tour of the dwelling.

Members of the Committee for the Environment will also be in attendance at this visit.
