TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

The Assembly is responsible for the costs attributed to Assembly Members on NIABT business and, as such, the NIABT is subject to internal audit scrutiny.

The Northern Ireland Assembly's contribution and expenditure related to NIABT activities is audited by the Northern Ireland Assembly Audit Office.

The vast majority of NIABT expenditure and financial transactions relate to the NIABT external bank account which is wholly funded by the business membership fee. Therefore, this account is subject to independent examination, which is carried out by Bridge, Chartered Accountants.

NIABT's mission statement:

"To advance and encourage business understanding of the Assembly and Assembly Members' understanding of business."

NIABT's Activities:

- -Providing Assembly Members with a better insight into how the local business sector operates thereby faciliating them in making more informed judgements on policy and legislation relating to the local economy, and;
- -Improving the business community's understanding of how the Assembly and devolution works and how policy and legislation is initiated and devoloped.

Developments in 2018/19

At the NIABT AGM on 13th December 2017, the NIABT membership voted to dissolve the Trust and also as to how the funds should be disbursed in line with the articles of the Trust. However, the Board subsequently met on Wednesday 19th February 2018 and unanimously agreed that dissolution and disbursal of funds should be put on hold until the political situation became clearer. The Board of Trustees met again in September 2018 and January 2019 and they agreed to maintain that position.

An AGM took place on 6th March 2019 at which it was ratified that no elections were required to the Board of Trustees and that the current Trustees should continue in post to oversee the agreed winding up of the Trust as and when the time was considered appropriate. It was also decided not to accept nominations for new Business Member trustees.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF NORTHERN IRELAND ASSEMBLY AND BUSINESS TRUST

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

I Accounting policies

Charity information

Northern Ireland Assembly and Business Trust is a private company limited by guarantee incorporated in Northern Ireland. The registered office is Room 435, Parliament Buildings, Stormont, Belfast, BT4 3XX, Northern Ireland.

1.1 Accounting convention

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (as amended for accounting periods commencing from 1 January 2016). The Charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The Northern Ireland Assembly and Business Trust ('the charity') has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The accounts are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the Charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the accounts, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foresceable future.

Thus the Trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the accounts.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees' in furtherance of their charitable objectives unless the funds have been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.

1.4 Incoming resources

Income is recognised when the Charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received. Cash donations are recognised on receipt.

Other donations are recognised once the Charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount, Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

1.5 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised when there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure on charitable activities includes costs undertaken to further the purposes of the charity.

Support costs are those functions that assist the work of the charity but do not directly undertake charitable activities. Support costs include back office costs, finance, personnel, payroll and governance costs which supports the Charity's programmes and activities. These costs have been allocated to expenditure on charitable activities. The basis on which support costs have been allocated are set out in the notes to the accounts.

1.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks and bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

1.7 Financial instruments

The Charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of PRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised in the Charity's balance sheet when the Charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.
